## *Mayor and Council Message*

It is hard to believe that summer is behind us and schools will be in session shortly. Please remember to drive safely now that the students and school buses are on the roads again.

At the June 7<sup>th</sup> Mayor and Council meeting, the resignation of Councilman Robert Proto was accepted with regret due to Rob and his family's move to Oceanport, NJ. Rob served as council liaison to the Zoning Board of Adjustment, a member of the Planning Board, and was part of the PBA negotiating committee. Our thanks to Rob for his dedication to our town and we wish him and his family all the best in their new community. By statute, when a council member is unable to finish his/her term, the municipal committee for the political party of that council member has 30 days to present 3 candidates to the Mayor and Council for consideration as a replacement. The municipal committee submitted the names of Bud Prober, Roger DeBerardine, and Joanne Minichetti for consideration. The Council selected Joanne Minichetti to serve and she was sworn in at the July 11<sup>th</sup> Mayor and Council meeting. Joanne is a 15-year resident of Upper Saddle River and an involved volunteer in our borough. She is a former PTO president, founding member of the USR Educational Foundation, President of the Board of Health, co-chair of USR Vision 2020, and a Girl Scout leader for the past 13 years. The Council appointed Joanne to be liaison to the Zoning Board of Adjustment as well as a member of the Planning Board. She will

also serve in the capacity of Mayor's representative to the Library Board of Trustees.

The Mayor and Council would like to update our residents on some of the projects that have been taking place in our borough during the summer. United Water installed a water line from Lake Street to Skyline Drive, Hillcrest Drive, Wideview Drive and Saddle Horn Drive. Negotiations with United Water enabled us to provide fire hydrant protection to this area of town. Residents in that area also have the ability to hook up to the water main for their domestic water. Repaving of the affected streets will be scheduled in our street paving program. The second phase of Old Stone Church Road was also completed this summer. New curbing and paving from Patriots Lane to Deer Horn Trail were funded through a grant from the county. Unfortunately, these two projects overlapped for a time period causing traffic inconveniences. Originally, they were to be done at separate times and we apologize for the delays but are glad that both these projects were completed prior to the start of school. Lions Park renovations are progressing on schedule. Work on the south fields has been completed and work on the north fields has begun with an anticipated completion date of November. The last phase of the project will include the construction of a field house with restrooms as well as a running track for use by the entire community. The tennis courts by the schools are scheduled to be resurfaced next year. The cracks in the courts come back every 3-4 years since the sub-surface moves. Every 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> year, money that has accumulated from the tennis clinics and courts fees is used to repair the surface at a cost of approximately \$20,000.

All residents are encouraged to attend our 7<sup>th</sup> annual Upper Saddle River Day, scheduled for Saturday, September 8<sup>th</sup>

starting at 2:00 p.m (rain date, Sunday, September 9<sup>th</sup>). The Boy Scouts will once again be cooking the picnic-style food. Community organizations will be volunteering at the games and rides. At 8:00 p.m., a movie will be shown on the fields for everyone's enjoyment. Please remember to bring your own blanket or chairs to sit on at the movie. Advanced wristbands are available for purchase at Borough Hall. We would like to thank the USR Recreation Commission for all their hard work once again putting on such a wonderful community event. Look for additional details on the enclosed flyer.

## *Upper Saddle River Day 2007*

Scheduled to be held in Lions Park on Saturday, September 8<sup>th</sup>, USR Day 2007, will begin at 2:00 p.m. and conclude at 8:00 p.m. with a full-length feature film, which will be shown in the old "drive-in" style.

The rain date for this event is Sunday, September 9<sup>th</sup>.

## Garbage and Recycling

The garbage and recycling schedule for the month of September is listed in the chart below.

The garbage will continue to be picked up twice a week, Mondays and Thursdays. **There will not be garbage pick-up on Monday, September 3<sup>rd</sup> in observance of Labor Day. The next pick-up will be on Thursday, September 6<sup>th</sup>.** Please place your commingled bottles, cans and plastics in a reusable container. Newspapers, junk mail and cardboard should be tied into bundles. The recycling will remain on the same schedule, every other Tuesday. All refuse must be out by 6:30 a.m.

Please be sure not to have your garbage or driveway blocked by any cars or trucks. The garbage company will not take any chances of scratching any vehicle in your driveway by taking garbage around them. If there is vehicle in the way, the garbage will be left until the next scheduled pick up date.

If you think you have been missed for a pick-up, please call the Borough Hall by 10:00 a.m. the next day. You may leave a message on our answering machine which is on 24 hours a day.

For your convenience, the Recycling Depot, which is located behind the Borough Hall, is open every Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to noon. A monitor is on duty to assist you.

In general you may dispose of all types of paints, fertilizers, kerosene, blacktop sealer, motor oil, insecticides, fluorescent light bulbs and fire extinguishers.

Children, families, senior citizens or teams comprised of neighborhoods or local organizations can participate without a fee. You can also sign up at Borough Hall or learn more on the Borough's website, [www.USRToday.com](http://www.USRToday.com). Don't wait—participants will be limited to the first 250.

Each participant will receive a pedometer, a walking log and a T-shirt. Just get out and walk and record your progress. In June 2008 we'll be having a follow up meeting to recognize our most dedicated participants.

It's simple and fun. Walking can be done anywhere but the new track at Lions Field will be ready this fall, why not give it a try?

Federal guidelines suggest Americans engage in regular physical activity and reduce sedentary activities to promote health, psychological well being, and a healthy body weight. A doctor's okay is always recommended before embarking on a new exercise program.

- To avoid chronic health problems, engage in at least 30 minutes of moderate-intensity physical activity, above usual activity, on most days of the week.
- For most people, greater health benefits can be obtained by engaging in physical activity of more vigorous intensity or longer duration.
- To prevent gradual, unhealthy body weight gain in adulthood, engage in approximately 60 minutes of moderate- to vigorous-intensity activity on most days of the week while not exceeding caloric intake requirements.
